6	A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 2.2-4323 and 2.2-4324 of the Code of Virginia and to amend the Code
7	of Virginia by adding a section numbered 2.2-4328.2, relating to Virginia Public Procurement Act;
8	preference for plastic recycled materials.
9	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
10	1. That §§ 2.2-4323 and 2.2-4324 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted and that the
11	Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 2.2-4328.2 as follows:
12	§ 2.2-4323. Purchase programs for recycled goods; agency responsibilities.
13	A. All state agencies shall implement a purchase program for recycled goods and shall coordinate
14	their efforts so as to achieve the goals and objectives established in subsection C as well as those set forth
15	in §§ 10.1-1425.6, 10.1-1425.7, 10.1-1425.8, 2.2-4313, 2.2-4324, and 2.2-4326, and 2.2-4328.2.
16	B. The Department of Environmental Quality shall advise the Department of General Services
17	concerning the designation of recycled goods. In cooperation with the Department of General Services,
18	the Department of Environmental Quality shall increase the awareness of state agencies as to the benefits
19	of using such products.
20	C. The Department of General Services shall:
21	1. Ensure that the Commonwealth's procurement guidelines for state agencies promote the use of
22	recycled goods.
23	2. Promote the Commonwealth's interest in the use of recycled products to vendors.
24	3. Make agencies aware of the availability of recycled goods, including those that use post-
25	consumer and other recovered materials processed by Virginia-based companies.

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4. Make agencies aware of the availability of recycled materials and products certified as climate positive. For purposes of this subdivision, "climate positive" means having a negative carbon footprint.

- 28 D. All state agencies shall, to the greatest extent possible, adhere to the procurement program29 guidelines for recycled products to be established by the Department of General Services.
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§ 2.2-4324. Preference for Virginia firms.

A. In the case of a tie bid, preference shall be given to goods produced in Virginia, goods or
 services or construction provided by Virginia persons, firms, or corporations; otherwise the tie shall be
 decided by lot.

34 B. Whenever the lowest responsive and responsible bidder is a resident of any other state and such 35 state under its laws allows a resident contractor of that state a percentage preference, a like preference 36 shall be allowed to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder who is a resident of Virginia and is the 37 next lowest bidder. If the lowest responsive and responsible bidder is a resident of any other state and such 38 state under its laws allows a resident contractor of that state a price-matching preference, a like preference 39 shall be allowed to responsive and responsible bidders who are residents of Virginia. If the lowest bidder 40 is a resident contractor of a state with an absolute preference, the bid shall not be considered. The 41 Department of General Services shall post and maintain an updated list on its website of all states with an 42 absolute preference for their resident contractors and those states that allow their resident contractors a 43 percentage preference, including the respective percentage amounts. For purposes of compliance with this 44 section, all public bodies may rely upon the accuracy of the information posted on this website.

C. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsections A and B, in the case of a tie bid in instances
where goods are being offered, and existing price preferences have already been taken into account,
preference shall be given to the bidder whose goods contain the greatest amount of recycled content.D.
For the purposes of this section, a Virginia person, firm, or corporation shall be deemed to be a resident
of Virginia if such person, firm, or corporation has been organized pursuant to Virginia law or maintains
a principal place of business within Virginia.

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- <u>§ 2.2-4328.2. Preference for plastic recycled materials.</u>

In determining the award of any contract for plastic materials to be purchased for use by agencies
 of the Commonwealth, the Department of General Services shall procure using competitive sealed
 bidding, giving preference to bidders that supply materials containing plastic recycled content, as long as
 such materials are cost competitive with materials that do not contain plastic recycled content.

56 2. That the Department of General Services (the Department) shall promulgate regulations to 57 effectuate the provisions of § 2.2-4328.2 of the Code of Virginia, as created by this act. In 58 promulgating such regulations, the Department shall (i) consult with the Virginia Manufacturers Association to define the term "cost competitive" as it applies to the provisions of § 2.2-4328.2 of 59 60 the Code of Virginia, as created by this act, and (ii) establish a system that requires an incremental 61 increase in the minimum percentage of plastic recycled content required to be included in materials 62 in order for a bidder to be given preference in the procurement process, as follows: (a) 10 percent 63 plastic recycled content by January 1, 2025; (b) 20 percent plastic recycled content by January 1, 64 2028; and (c) 30 percent plastic recycled content by January 1, 2030.

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
