| 6 | A BILL to amend the Code of Virginia by adding in Chapter 8 of Title 63.2 a section numbered 63.2-806, |
| 7 | relating to Produce Rx Program established; report. |
| 8 | Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: |
| 9 | 1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Chapter 8 of Title 63.2 a section numbered |
| 10 | 63.2-806 as follows: |
| 11 | § 63.2-806. Produce Rx Program; report. |
| 12 | A. As used in this section: |
| 13 | "Eligible individual" means an individual for whom a licensed doctor of medicine, osteopathy, or |
| 14 | podiatry, licensed nurse practitioner, licensed physician assistant, or registered dietitian or nutritionist has |
| 15 | determined a diagnosis that would benefit from a produce prescription and has written such a prescription |
| 16 | and who is eligible for medical assistance services, Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), |
| 17 | Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), or Low-Income Household Energy Assistance |
| 18 | Program (LIHEAP) benefits in the Commonwealth. |
| 19 | "Qualified care provider" means any licensed doctor of medicine or osteopathy, licensed physician |
| 20 | assistant, licensed nurse practitioner, or registered dietician or nutritionist. |
| 21 | "Qualifying fruits and vegetables" means any variety of fresh, canned, dried, or frozen whole or |
| 22 | cut fruits and vegetables without added sugars, fats, oils, or sodium. |
| 23 | B. The Department shall establish a Produce Rx Program (the Program) as a three-year pilot |
| 24 | program in every region of the Commonwealth to incentivize consumption of qualifying fruits and |
| 25 | vegetables by eligible individuals for whom increased consumption of fruits and vegetables is |
| 26 | recommended by a qualified care provider. Such Program shall include: |

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| 27 | 1. Eligibility criteria for participation in the Program, including criteria for eligible individuals and |
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| 28 | qualified care providers; |
| 29 | 2. A process for enrolling eligible individuals in the Program; |
| 30 | 3. A process for verifying qualified care providers for participation in the Program; |
| 31 | 4. A process for verification of a variety of eligible vendors of food items covered by the Program, |
| 32 | which shall include verification of the ability of such vendors to provide approved food items; |
| 33 | 5. A process for the issuance by qualified care providers to eligible individuals of Program |
| 34 | vouchers that may be redeemed for the purchase of qualifying fruits and vegetables; and |
| 35 | 6. Reporting requirements for qualified care providers who provide Program vouchers. |
| 36 | C. The Program shall include provisions for technical assistance for qualified care providers and |
| 37 | vendors and robust data collection and evaluation activities. |
| 38 | D. The Department shall report annually by December 1 to the Governor and the General |
| 39 | Assembly data and information about the Program, including the number of eligible individuals receiving |
| 40 | vouchers through the Program and the number and location of qualified care providers participating in the |
| 41 | Program, the total value of vouchers issued to eligible individuals, and the total value of vouchers |
| 42 | redeemed. |
| 43 | 2. That the Department of Social Services (the Department) shall convene a work group that shall |
| 44 | include representatives of the Virginia Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics, the American Heart |
| 45 | Association, the Virginia Farmers Market Association, the Virginia Chapter of the American |
| 46 | Academy of Pediatrics, and the Virginia Association of Free and Charitable Clinics to advise the |
| 47 | Department on the design of the Produce Rx Program established pursuant to this act. |

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
