2	AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE
3	(Proposed by the Senate Committee on Education and Health

6	A BILL to amend and reenact § 22.1-253.13:7 of the Code of Virginia, relating to public school libraries;
7	printed and audiovisual materials; selection, evaluation, and checkout procedures.
8	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
9	1. That § 22.1-253.13:7 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
10	§ 22.1-253.13:7. Standard 7. School board policies.
11	A. Each local school board shall develop policies and procedures to address complaints of sexual
12	abuse of a student by a teacher or other school board employee.
13	B. Each local school board shall maintain and follow up-to-date policies. All school board policies
14	shall be reviewed at least every five years and revised as needed.
15	C. Each local school board shall ensure that policies are developed giving consideration to the
16	views of teachers, parents, and other concerned citizens and addressing the following:
17	1. A system of two-way communication between employees and the local school board and its
18	administrative staff whereby matters of concern can be discussed in an orderly and constructive manner;
19	2. The selection and evaluation of all instructional materials purchased by the school division and
20	all printed and audiovisual materials purchased by, donated to, or otherwise made available to the school
21	division that will be available to students in school libraries, with clear procedures for (i) mandatory prior
22	written parental consent before a student is permitted to check out from the school library any such printed
23	or audiovisual materials that depict a child engaged in the fondling of the sexual or genital parts of another
24	or the fondling of his sexual or genital parts by another, masturbation, sexual intercourse, cunnilingus,
25	fellatio, anilingus, anal intercourse, or object sexual penetration and (ii) handling challenged controversial
26	instructional materials;

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27	3. The standards of student conduct and attendance and enforcement procedures designed to
28	provide that public education be conducted in an atmosphere free of disruption and threat to persons or
29	property and supportive of individual rights;
30	4. School-community communications and community involvement;
31	5. Guidelines to encourage parents to provide instructional assistance to their children in the home,
32	which may include voluntary training for the parents of children in grades K through three;
33	6. Information about procedures for addressing concerns with the school division and recourse
34	available to parents pursuant to § 22.1-87;
35	7. A cooperatively developed procedure for personnel evaluation appropriate to tasks performed
36	by those being evaluated; and
37	8. Grievances, dismissals, etc., of teachers, and the implementation procedure prescribed by the
38	General Assembly and the Board of Education, as provided in Article 3 (§ 22.1-306 et seq.) of Chapter
39	15, and the maintenance of copies of such procedures.
40	D. A current copy of all school division policies and regulations approved by the local school
41	board, including the Student Conduct Policy, shall be posted on the division's website and shall be
42	available to employees and to the public. School boards shall ensure that printed copies of such policies
43	and regulations are available as needed to citizens who do not have online access.
44	E. An annual announcement shall be made in each division at the beginning of the school year
45	and, for parents of students enrolling later in the academic year, at the time of enrollment, advising the

public that the policies are available in such places.

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
