9	1. § 1. The State Corporation Commission shall convene a stakeholder workgroup to evaluate shared solar
10	programs for Phase I Utilities, including those utilities subject to the exemption in subsection G of § 56-
11	580 of the Code of Virginia. The stakeholder workgroup shall include representatives from the Coalition
12	for Community Solar Access, Phase I Utilities, the Department of Energy, low-income community solar
13	advocates, consumer protection advocates, solar advocacy organizations, environmental advocacy
14	organizations, the Chesapeake Solar and Storage Association and other solar industry and shared solar
15	stakeholders, and community advocacy groups. The stakeholder workgroup shall permit remote or
16	electronic participation in meetings, which may be held at any location in the Commonwealth. The staff
17	of the State Corporation Commission (the Commission) shall facilitate and document the proceedings of
18	the stakeholder workgroup and submit a written report to the Chairmen of the House Committee on
19	Commerce and Energy and the Senate Committee on Commerce and Labor no later than November 30,
20	2022, and make copies of the report publicly available on the Commission's website at the same time as
21	submission to the House and Senate Committees.
