6	A BILL to direct the Board of Funeral Directors and Embalmers to convene a work group to determine
7	how to regulate and implement the process of alkaline hydrolysis in the Commonwealth.
8	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
9	1. § 1. That the Board of Funeral Directors and Embalmers (the Board) shall convene a work group
10	consisting of relevant stakeholders to determine the (i) regulatory and statutory changes needed to legalize,
11	implement, and regulate the process of alkaline hydrolysis in the Commonwealth; (ii) necessary
12	qualifications to enable a person to engage in the practice of aquamation; (iii) proper standards for the
13	operation of an aquatorium; and (iv) proper requirements for licensure as an aquamator. In conducting its
14	study, the work group shall consider any necessary environmental precautions and safety measures to
15	ensure proper (a) regulation and implementation of the aquamation process and (b) regulation and
16	inspection of aquatoriums in the Commonwealth. The Board shall report the results of such study to the
17	Chairmen of the Senate Committee on Education and Health and the House Committee on Health, Welfare
18	and Institutions on or before November 1, 2022.
19	§ 2. For purposes of this act:
20	"Alkaline hydrolysis" or "aquamation" means a water-based process of dissolution using alkaline
21	chemicals and agitation.
22	"Aquamator" means a person or establishment that owns or operates an aquatorium.
23	"Aquatorium" means a facility containing a pressure vessel for the aquamation of dead human
24	bodies.
25	2. That the Board of Funeral Directors and Embalmers shall promulgate regulations to implement
26	the provisions of this act to be effective on July 1, 2023.

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
