6	A BILL to amend and reenact § 2.2-4002 of the Code of Virginia, relating to executive branch agencies;
7	posting of regulations.
8	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
9	1. That § 2.2-4002 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
10	§ 2.2-4002. Exemptions from chapter generally.
11	A. Although required to comply with § 2.2-4103 of the Virginia Register Act (§ 2.2-4100 et seq.),
12	the following agencies shall be exempted from the provisions of this chapter, except to the extent that they
13	are specifically made subject to §§ 2.2-4024, 2.2-4030, and 2.2-4031:
14	1. The General Assembly.
15	2. Courts, any agency of the Supreme Court, and any agency that by the Constitution is expressly
16	granted any of the powers of a court of record.
17	3. The Department of Wildlife Resources in promulgating regulations regarding the management
18	of wildlife and for all case decisions rendered pursuant to any provisions of Chapters 2 (§ 29.1-200 et
19	seq.), 3 (§ 29.1-300 et seq.), 4 (§ 29.1-400 et seq.), 5 (§ 29.1-500 et seq.), and 7 (§ 29.1-700 et seq.) of
20	Title 29.1.
21	4. The Virginia Housing Development Authority.
22	5. Municipal corporations, counties, and all local, regional, or multijurisdictional authorities
23	created under this Code, including those with federal authorities.
24	6. Educational institutions operated by the Commonwealth, provided that, with respect to § 2.2-
25	4031, such educational institutions shall be exempt from the publication requirements only with respect
26	to regulations that pertain to (i) their academic affairs, (ii) the selection, tenure, promotion, and

disciplining of faculty and employees, (iii) the selection of students, and (iv) rules of conduct anddisciplining of students.

7. The Milk Commission in promulgating regulations regarding (i) producers' licenses and bases,
(ii) classification and allocation of milk, computation of sales, and shrinkage, and (iii) class prices for
producers' milk, time and method of payment, butterfat testing, and differential.

44 14. The Board of Optometry when specifying therapeutic pharmaceutical agents, treatment
45 guidelines, and diseases and abnormal conditions of the human eye and its adnexa for TPA-certification
46 of optometrists pursuant to Article 5 (§ 54.1-3222 et seq.) of Chapter 32 of Title 54.1.

47 15. The Commissioner of the Department of Veterans Services in adopting regulations pursuant48 to § 2.2-2001.3.

49 16. The State Board of Education, in developing, issuing, and revising guidelines pursuant to §50 22.1-203.2.

51 17. The Virginia Racing Commission, (i) when acting by and through its duly appointed stewards
52 or in matters related to any specific race meeting or (ii) in promulgating technical rules regulating actual
53 live horse racing at race meetings licensed by the Commission.

55	19. The Virginia Economic Development Partnership Authority.
55 56	20. The Board of Agriculture and Consumer Services in adopting, amending, or repealing
57	regulations pursuant to subsection A (ii) of § 59.1-156.

59	22. The Board of Health in promulgating the list of diseases that shall be reported to the
60	Department of Health pursuant to § 32.1-35 and in adopting, amending, or repealing regulations pursuant
61	to subsection C of § 35.1-14 that incorporate the Food and Drug Administration's Food Code pertaining
62	to restaurants or food service.
63	23. The Board of Pharmacy when specifying special subject requirements for continuing education
64	for pharmacists pursuant to § 54.1-3314.1.
65	24. The Virginia Department of Veterans Services when promulgating rules and regulations
66	pursuant to § 58.1-3219.7 or 58.1-3219.11.
67	25. The Virginia Department of Criminal Justice Services when developing, issuing, or revising
68	any training standards established by the Criminal Justice Services Board under § 9.1-102, provided such
69	actions are authorized by the Governor in the interest of public safety.
70	B. Agency action relating to the following subjects shall be exempted from the provisions of this
71	chapter:
72	1. Money or damage claims against the Commonwealth or agencies thereof.
73	2. The award or denial of state contracts, as well as decisions regarding compliance therewith.
74	3. The location, design, specifications, or construction of public buildings or other facilities.
75	4. Grants of state or federal funds or property.
76	5. The chartering of corporations.
77	6. Customary military, militia, naval, or police functions.
78	7. The selection, tenure, dismissal, direction, or control of any officer or employee of an agency
79	of the Commonwealth.
80	8. The conduct of elections or eligibility to vote.

81 9. Inmates of prisons or other such facilities or parolees therefrom. 82 10. The custody of persons in, or sought to be placed in, mental health facilities or penal or other 83 state institutions as well as the treatment, supervision, or discharge of such persons. 84 11. Traffic signs, markers, or control devices. 85 12. Instructions for application or renewal of a license, certificate, or registration required by law. 86 13. Content of, or rules for the conduct of, any examination required by law. 87 14. The administration of pools authorized by Chapter 47 (§ 2.2-4700 et seq.). 88 15. Any rules for the conduct of specific lottery games, so long as such rules are not inconsistent 89 with duly adopted regulations of the Virginia Lottery Board, and provided that such regulations are 90 published and posted. 91 16. Orders condemning or closing any shellfish, finfish, or crustacea growing area and the 92 shellfish, finfish, or crustacea located thereon pursuant to Article 2 (§ 28.2-803 et seq.) of Chapter 8 of 93 Title 28.2. 94 17. Any operating procedures for review of child deaths developed by the State Child Fatality 95 Review Team pursuant to § 32.1-283.1, any operating procedures for review of adult deaths developed by 96 the Adult Fatality Review Team pursuant to § 32.1-283.5, any operating procedures for review of adult 97 deaths developed by the Maternal Mortality Review Team pursuant to § 32.1-283.8, and any operating 98 procedures for review of the deaths of persons with a developmental disability developed by the 99 Developmental Disabilities Mortality Review Committee pursuant to § 37.2-314.1. 100 18. The regulations for the implementation of the Health Practitioners' Monitoring Program and 101 the activities of the Health Practitioners' Monitoring Program Committee pursuant to Chapter 25.1 (§ 54.1-102 2515 et seq.) of Title 54.1. 103 19. The process of reviewing and ranking grant applications submitted to the Commonwealth 104 Neurotrauma Initiative Advisory Board pursuant to Article 12 (§ 51.5-178 et seq.) of Chapter 14 of Title 105 51.5. 106 20. Loans from the Small Business Environmental Compliance Assistance Fund pursuant to 107 Article 4 (§ 10.1-1197.1 et seq.) of Chapter 11.1 of Title 10.1.

108	21. The Virginia Breeders Fund created pursuant to § 59.1-372.
109	22. The types of pari-mutuel wagering pools available for live or simulcast horse racing.
110	23. The administration of medication or other substances foreign to the natural horse.
111	24. Any rules adopted by the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services for the approval
112	and conduct of game variations for the conduct of raffles, bingo, network bingo, and instant bingo games,
113	provided that such rules are (i) consistent with Article 1.1:1 (§ 18.2-340.15 et seq.) of Chapter 8 of Title
114	18.2 and (ii) published and posted.
115	C. Minor changes to regulations published in the Virginia Administrative Code under the Virginia
116	Register Act (§ 2.2-4100 et seq.), made by the Virginia Code Commission pursuant to § 30-150, shall be
117	exempt from the provisions of this chapter.
118	D. Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, actions undertaken by an executive branch agency
119	that are subject to the provisions of § 2.2-4103 of the Virginia Register Act shall be posted on the Virginia
120	Regulatory Town Hall at each stage of the regulatory process. Such actions shall also include an economic
121	impact analysis and any other information requested pursuant to instructions issued by the Department of
122	Planning and Budget.

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
