6	Directing the Secretary of Commerce and Trade to study the effects of daylight saving time on the
7	Commonwealth; report.
8	Whereas, the Commonwealth has fully participated in the observance of daylight saving time by
9	turning clocks forward one hour in the spring and back one hour in the fall since 1967, with the
10	implementation of the federal Uniform Time Act of 1966 (15 U.S.C. § 260 et seq.); and
11	Whereas, the overwhelming conclusion of researchers is that the act of changing the clocks twice
12	per year directly results in an increase in heart attacks, traffic accidents, workplace injuries, pedestrian
13	deaths, crime, and sleep disruption as well as a loss of productivity; and
14	Whereas, research suggests an association between the biannual clock change and seasonal
15	affective disorder, strokes, and cardiac arrest; and
16	Whereas, researchers have determined that remaining in daylight saving time year-round will save
17	significant amounts of energy in November and February and will lead to a decrease in childhood obesity
18	by increasing the amount of sunlight after school hours; and
19	Whereas, 19 states have enacted legislation to provide for a year-round daylight saving time if
20	allowed to do so by Congress; now, therefore,
21	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
22	1. § 1. That the Secretary of Commerce and Trade (the Secretary) shall study the effects of daylight saving
23	time on the Commonwealth. In conducting this study, the Secretary shall (i) review the effect of the
24	Commonwealth's continued participation under the Uniform Time Act of 1966 (15 U.S.C. § 260 et seq.),
25	(ii) determine the potential consequences of a decision to use standard time year-round in the
26	Commonwealth, (iii) determine the potential consequences of a decision to use daylight saving time year-

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appropriate. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Secretary for this study, upon request. The Secretary shall complete his meetings by November 30, 2023, and shall submit to the Governor and the General Assembly an executive summary and a report of his findings and recommendations for publication as a House or Senate document. The executive summary and report shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports no later than the first day of the 2024 Regular Session of the General Assembly and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website.

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
