6	Directing the Board of Funeral Directors and Embalmers to study the establishment of natural organic
7	reduction, also known as green burial or human composting, facilities in the Commonwealth.
8	Report.
9	WHEREAS, the term "natural organic reduction" means the contained, accelerated conversion of
10	human remains to soil; and
11	WHEREAS, the term "natural organic reduction facility" means a structure, room, or other space
12	in a building or real property where natural organic reduction of a human body occurs; and
13	WHEREAS, natural organic reduction provides a sustainable alternative to cremation and burial;
14	now, therefore, be it
15	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Board of Funeral
16	Directors and Embalmers be directed to study the establishment of natural organic reduction, also known
17	as green burial or human composting, facilities in the Commonwealth.
18	In conducting its study, the Board of Funeral Directors and Embalmers (the Board) shall convene
19	a work group consisting of relevant stakeholders to determine (i) the regulatory and statutory changes
20	needed to legalize, implement, and regulate the process of natural organic reduction; (ii) proper standards
21	for the operation of a facility for the purposes of natural organic reduction; (iii) proper requirements for
22	licensing and permitting related to natural organic compounding; and (iv) the feasibility of establishing
23	natural organic reduction facilities in the Commonwealth.
24	The work group shall provide opportunity for public participation and consider any necessary
25	environmental precautions and safety measures to ensure proper (a) regulation and implementation of the

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26	natural organic reduction process and (b) regulation and inspection of facilities where natural organic
27	reduction is conducted in the Commonwealth.
28	The Board shall submit a summary of the work group's findings and recommendations to the
29	Chairmen of the Senate Committee on Education and Health and the House Committee on Health

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Welfare, and Institutions no later than December 1, 2023.
