6	A BILL to amend the Code of Virginia by adding a section numbered 22.1-18.2, relating to Board of
7	Education; advanced academic opportunity programs; guidelines and policies; availability.
8	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
9	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 22.1-18.2 as follows:
10	§ 22.1-18.2. Advanced academic opportunity programs; guidelines and policies; availability.
11	A. As used in this section:
12	"Advanced academic opportunity programs" means any academic program that provides a
13	specialty curriculum that has the goal of promoting accelerated learning and advanced academic standing.
14	Such programs include magnet school programs, language immersion programs, visual or performing arts
15	programs, and leadership and enrichment programs. "Advanced academic opportunity programs" does not
16	include any Academic-Year Governor's Schools or regional Career and Technical Education (CTE)
17	Governor's Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) Academies.
18	"Eligible student" includes any student who has demonstrated an ability to participate and succeed
19	in advanced academic opportunities, as determined by (i) such student's performance on a merit-based
20	application, (ii) such student's aptitude based on grades or exam results, or (iii) the recommendation of a
21	teacher.
22	"Secondary school" includes middle and high school grades.
23	B. The Board shall develop guidelines for the administration and availability of advanced
24	academic opportunity programs offered at the secondary school level. Such guidelines shall (i) require
25	any advanced academic opportunity program offered at any public secondary school in the

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26 <u>Commonwealth to accept any eligible student and (ii) prohibit the imposition of class sizes or any other</u>
27 limitation that would impede the access of any otherwise eligible student to such program.

28 <u>C. Each local school board shall develop and adopt policies in accordance with the guidelines</u>

29 developed by the Board pursuant to subsection B for the administration and availability of advanced

30 academic opportunity programs offered at any public secondary school in such school division. Each local

31 school board's policies shall be at least as rigorous as but may be more comprehensive than the guidelines

32 developed by the Board pursuant to subsection B.

2. That the Department of Education shall convene a work group of relevant stakeholders, including
representatives from the Virginia Education Association, the Virginia Association of School
Superintendents, and the local school boards, for the purpose of making recommendations on
policies for advanced academic opportunity programs as required by this act. The work group shall
submit its recommendations to the Chairmen of the House Committee on Education and the Senate
Committee on Education and Health by July 1, 2024.

39 3. That the Board of Education shall make available to each local school board the guidelines for 40 advanced academic opportunity programs as required by this act by February 1, 2025, and each 41 local school board shall implement policies consistent with such guidelines no later than the 42 beginning of the 2025–2026 school year.

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
