6	A BILL to amend and reenact § 22.1-291.1:1 of the Code of Virginia, relating to school counselors; staff
7	time.
8	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
9	1. That § 22.1-291.1:1 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
10	§ 22.1-291.1:1. School counselors; staff time.
11	A. As used in this section:
12	"Appraisal and advisement" means the act of assisting students in exploring their abilities,
13	interests, skills, and achievement to make decisions and develop immediate and long-range goals and
14	<u>plans.</u>
15	"Consultation, collaboration, and referrals" means the act of (i) providing information to and
16	receiving information from individuals or teams to support a student's needs; (ii) working and
17	communicating with parents, teachers, administrators, other school staff, and community stakeholders to
18	(a) promote achievement for a specific student or (b) promote systemic change to address the needs of
19	groups of underserved or underrepresented groups of students; and (iii) referring students to outside
20	providers and resources as necessary.
21	"Crisis counseling" means the act of providing counseling to individual students or small groups
22	of students to help such students navigate critical situations such as emergencies and crises.
23	"Direct counseling" means counseling programs and activities aimed at supporting students in
24	mental health and wellness, academic achievement, and college and career planning, and includes school
25	counseling curriculum lessons and activities, individual counseling, small group counseling, crisis

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26	counseling, appraisal and advisement, and consultation, collaboration, and referrals. "Direct counseling'
27	does not include program planning and school support.
28	"Individual counseling" means the act of providing developmentally appropriate, goal-focused
29	and brief counseling sessions to individual students to address issues relating to mental health and
30	wellness, social and emotional development, academic achievement, and college and career readiness.
31	"Program planning and school support" means the act of defining, planning, managing, and
32	assessing school counseling activities. "Program planning and school support" includes the act of
33	reviewing data, creating annual student outcome goals, creating action plans and results reports, holding
34	annual administrative conferences, monitoring use-of-time, creating annual and weekly calendars, and
35	facilitating school counseling advisory councils.
36	"School counseling curriculum lessons and activities" means the act of providing data-informed
37	lessons or activities at the classroom level or on a schoolwide basis to provide students with the
38	knowledge, attitudes, and skills appropriate for their developmental levels.
39	"Small group counseling" means the act of providing counseling to small groups of students with
40	similar developmental or situational challenges with the goal of improving achievement, attendance,
41	mental health or wellness, or behavioral outcomes.
42	B. Each school counselor employed by a school board in a public elementary or secondary school
43	shall spend at least 80 percent of his staff time during normal school hours in the direct counseling of
44	individual students or groups of students and may spend up to 20 percent of his staff time during normal
45	school hours on program planning and school support.

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
