6	A BILL to amend the Code of Virginia by adding in Chapter 8 of Title 63.2 a section numbered 63.2-807,
7	relating to Home Visiting Program established.
8	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
9	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Chapter 8 of Title 63.2 a section numbered
10	63.2-807 as follows:
11	§ 63.2-807. Home Visiting Program established; purpose.
12	The Home Visiting Program (the Program) is hereby created. The Program shall be administered
13	by the Department in accordance with regulations established by the Board. The purpose of the Program
14	shall be to (i) develop a plan for the provision of home visiting services to pregnant people and parents;
15	(ii) administer home visiting services provided by family support professionals; and (iii) coordinate
16	approval of funding, allocation of funds, and data reporting on funding.
17	2. That the Department of Social Services (the Department) shall promulgate regulations to
18	implement the provisions of this act to be effective no later than November 1, 2024. The
19	Department's initial adoption of regulations necessary to implement the provisions of this act shall
20	be exempt from the Administrative Process Act (§ 2.2-4000 et seq. of the Code of Virginia), except
21	that the Department shall provide an opportunity for public comment on the regulations prior to
22	adoption. In establishing such regulations, the Department shall:
23	A. Ensure that Home Visiting Program services are provided by family support professionals
24	trained to implement evidence-based program models and who demonstrate proficiency in
25	standardized, competency-based criteria. Such professionals shall provide anticipatory guidance,

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26	parenting education, parenting conduct screening, assessment for and referrals to necessary
27	support services, and developmental and behavioral health interventions.
28	B. Direct the Home Visiting Program (the Program) to coordinate with the Department of
29	Social Services, the Department of Health, the Department of Medical Assistance Services, the
30	Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services, and the Department of Education
31	on funding.
32	C. Direct the Program to coordinate its funding with the Maternal, Infant, and Early
33	Childhood Home Visiting Program administered by the U.S. Health Resources and Services
34	Administration in order to minimize administrative burdens and maximize effective service
35	delivery.
36	D. Balance the need for statewide funding with the need to ensure sufficient funding for
37	meaningful services.

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
