6	A BILL to amend and reenact § 18.2-308.5 of the Code of Virginia and to amend the Code of Virginia by
7	adding a section numbered 18.2-308.5:2, relating to manufacture, import, sale, transfer, or
8	possession of plastic firearms and unfinished frames or receivers and unserialized firearms
9	prohibited; penalties.
10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 18.2-308.5 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted and that the Code of Virginia
12	is amended by adding a section numbered 18.2-308.5:2 as follows:
13	§ 18.2-308.5. Manufacture, assemble, import, etc. of plastic firearm prohibited; penalty.
14	A. It-shall-be_is unlawful for any person to knowingly manufacture or assemble, cause to be
15	manufactured or assembled, import, <u>purchase</u> , sell, <u>offer for sale</u> , transfer, or possess (i) any plastic firearm
16	or (ii) any firearm that, after removal of all parts other than a major component, is not detectable as a
17	firearm by the types of detection devices, including X-ray machines, commonly used at airports,
18	government buildings, schools, correctional facilities, and other locations for security screening.
19	B. As used in this section, "plastie:
20	"Frame" and "receiver" have the same meanings attributed to them in 18 U.S.C. § 921 et seq. and
21	regulations issued pursuant thereto.
22	"Major component" means (i) the slide or cylinder, or the frame or receiver, of the firearm or (ii)
23	in the case of a rifle or shotgun, the barrel of the firearm.
24	"Plastic firearm" means any firearm, including machine guns and sawed-off shotguns as defined
25	in this chapter, containing less than 3.7 ounces of electromagnetically detectable metal in the barrel, slide,
26	cylinder, frame, or receiver-of which that, when subjected to inspection by the types of detection devices,

27	including X-ray machines, commonly used at airports, government buildings, schools, correctional
28	facilities, and other locations for security screening, does not generate an image that accurately depicts its
29	shape.
30	C. A violation of this section shall be is punishable as a Class 5 felony.
31	§ 18.2-308.5:2. Prohibition on unfinished frames or receivers and unserialized firearms;
32	penalties.
33	A. As used in this section:
34	"Federal licensee authorized to serialize firearms" means a person, firm, corporation, or other
35	entity that holds any valid federal license that authorizes the person, firm, corporation, or other entity to
36	imprint serial numbers onto firearms and completed or unfinished frames or receivers pursuant to 18
37	U.S.C. § 921 et seq. and regulations issued pursuant thereto.
38	"Federally licensed gunsmith, manufacturer, or importer" means a person, firm, corporation, or
39	other entity that holds a valid gunsmith license or license to manufacture or import firearms issued
40	pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 921 et seq. and regulations issued pursuant thereto.
41	"Frame" and "receiver" have the same meanings attributed to them in 18 U.S.C. § 921 et seq. and
42	regulations issued pursuant thereto.
43	"License to manufacture firearms" means a valid license to manufacture firearms issued pursuant
44	to 18 U.S.C. § 921 et seq. and regulations issued pursuant thereto.
45	"Manufacture or assemble" means to fabricate, construct, fit together component parts of, or
46	otherwise produce a firearm or completed or unfinished frame or receiver, including through additive,
47	subtractive, or other processes.
48	"Unfinished frame or receiver" means a forging, casting, printing, extrusion, machined body, or
49	similar item that (i) is designed to or may readily be completed, assembled, or otherwise converted to
50	function as a frame or receiver or (ii) is marketed or sold to the public to become or be used as the frame
51	or receiver of a functional firearm once completed, assembled, or otherwise converted. However,
52	"unfinished frame or receiver" does not include a component designed and intended for use in an antique
53	weapon.

"Valid serial number" means a serial number that has been imprinted by a federal licensee
authorized to serialize firearms in accordance with federal law, or that has otherwise been assigned to a
firearm or completed or unfinished frame or receiver pursuant to the laws of any state or pursuant to 26
U.S.C. § 5801 et seq. and regulations issued pursuant thereto.
B. It is unlawful to knowingly import, purchase, sell, offer for sale, or transfer ownership of any
completed or unfinished frame or receiver, unless the completed or unfinished frame or receiver (i) is
deemed to be a firearm pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 921 et seq. and regulations issued pursuant thereto and (ii)
is imprinted with a valid serial number.
C. It is unlawful to knowingly possess a firearm or any completed or unfinished frame or receiver
that is not imprinted with a valid serial number.
D. It is unlawful to manufacture or assemble, cause to be manufactured or assembled, import,
purchase, sell, offer for sale, or transfer ownership of any firearm that is not imprinted with a valid serial
number.
E. Except as authorized by law, it is unlawful for a person who does not have a valid federal license
E. Except as authorized by law, it is unlawful for a person who does not have a valid federal license to manufacture or assemble firearms to sell or transfer ownership of a firearm if (i) the person

To serialize a firearm, frame, or receiver, the dealer or other licensee shall imprint on the firearm, frame, or receiver a serial number beginning with the dealer's or licensee's abbreviated federal firearms licensee.

86	number on a firearm, frame, or receiver pursuant to this subsection shall make a record at the time of the
87	transaction of each transaction involving serializing a firearm, frame, or receiver and keep that record.
88	The record shall include the following information: the date, name, age, and residence of any person to
89	whom the item is transferred and the unique serial number imprinted on the firearm, frame, or receiver.
90	G. A violation of this section is punishable as a Class 1 misdemeanor. A second or subsequent
91	violation of this section is punishable as a Class 4 felony.
92	H. The provisions of subsection B or C shall not apply to any person possessing or receiving the
93	firearm who is a local, state, or federal law-enforcement officer or a federal firearms importer or federal
94	firearms manufacturer in the scope and course of his official duties or employment.
95	I. This section does not apply to any of the following:
96	1. A firearm, frame, receiver, or unfinished frame or receiver that (i) is an antique firearm as
97	defined in subsection F of § 18.2-308.2:2, (ii) has been rendered permanently inoperable, or (iii) was
98	manufactured before October 22, 1968;
99	2. The sale, offer for sale, or transfer of ownership of a firearm or any completed or unfinished
100	frame or receiver to a law-enforcement agency;
101	3. The manufacture or assembly, importation, purchase, transfer, or possession of a firearm or any
102	completed or unfinished frame or receiver by a law-enforcement agency for law-enforcement purposes;
103	4. The sale or transfer of ownership of a firearm or any completed or unfinished frame or receiver
104	to a federally licensed gunsmith, manufacturer, or importer or to any other federal licensee authorized to

106	5. The manufacture or assembly, importation, purchase, or possession of a firearm or any
107	completed or unfinished frame or receiver by a federally licensed gunsmith, manufacturer, or importer or
108	by any other federal licensee authorized to serialize firearms;
109	6. A member of the Armed Forces of the United States or the National Guard while on duty and
110	acting within the scope and course of employment or any law-enforcement agency or forensic laboratory;
111	7. A common carrier, motor carrier, air carrier, or carrier affiliated with an air carrier through
112	common controlling interest that is subject to Title 49 of the United States Code, or an authorized agent
113	of any such carrier, when acting in the course and scope of duties incident to the receipt, processing,
114	transportation, or delivery of property;
115	8. An authorized representative of a local, state, or federal government that receives a firearm or
116	any completed or unfinished frame or receiver as part of an authorized, voluntary buyback program in
117	which the governmental entity is buying or receiving such weapons from private individuals;
118	9. The possession and disposition of a firearm or any completed or unfinished frame or receiver
119	by a person who meets all of the following:
120	a. The person is not prohibited by Virginia or federal law from possessing the weapon;
121	b. The person possessed the firearm or any completed or unfinished frame or receiver no longer
122	than was necessary to deliver it to a law-enforcement agency for that agency's disposition according to
123	law; and
124	c. If the person is transporting the firearm or any completed or unfinished frame or receiver, the
125	person is transporting it to a law-enforcement agency in order to deliver it to the agency for the agency's
126	disposition according to law;
127	10. The possession or importation of a firearm or any completed or unfinished frame or receiver
128	by a nonresident of the Commonwealth who:
129	a. Is traveling with the firearm or completed or unfinished frame or receiver in the Commonwealth
130	in accordance with the provisions of 18 U.S.C. § 926A; or

131	b. Possesses or imports the firearm or completed or unfinished frame or receiver in the
132	Commonwealth exclusively for use in an organized sport shooting event or competition and no longer
133	than reasonably necessary to participate in such an event or competition; or
134	11. The possession or importation of a firearm or any completed or unfinished frame or receiver
135	by a new resident moving into the Commonwealth who, within 90 days of moving into the
136	Commonwealth, causes the firearm or completed or unfinished frame or receiver to be imprinted with a
137	valid serial number, removes the weapon from the Commonwealth, or otherwise comes into compliance
138	with this section.
