6	A BILL to amend the Code of Virginia by adding a section numbered 18.2-251.5, relating to
7	manufacturing, selling, giving, distributing, or possessing xylazine; penalty.
8	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
9	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 18.2-251.5 as follows:
10	§ 18.2-251.5. Manufacturing, selling, giving, distributing, or possessing xylazine; penalties.
11	A. Any person who knowingly manufactures, sells, gives, distributes, or possesses with the intent
12	to manufacture, sell, give, or distribute the substance xylazine, when intended for human consumption, is
13	guilty of a Class 5 felony.
14	B. Any person who knowingly possesses the substance xylazine, when intended for human
15	consumption, is guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor.
16	C. Notwithstanding subsections A and B, it shall not be an offense to (i) manufacture xylazine for
17	legitimate veterinary use; (ii) distribute or sell xylazine for authorized veterinary use; (iii) possess,
18	administer, prescribe, or dispense xylazine in good faith for use by animals within the course of legitimate
19	veterinary practice; or (iv) possess or administer xylazine pursuant to a valid prescription from a licensed
20	veterinarian.
21	2. That the provisions of this act may result in a net increase in periods of imprisonment or
22	commitment. Pursuant to § 30-19.1:4 of the Code of Virginia, the estimated amount of the necessary
23	appropriation cannot be determined for periods of imprisonment in state adult correctional
24	facilities; therefore, Chapter 1 of the Acts of Assembly of 2023, Special Session I, requires the
25	Virginia Criminal Sentencing Commission to assign a minimum fiscal impact of \$50,000. Pursuant

26 to § 30-19.1:4 of the Code of Virginia, the estimated amount of the necessary appropriation cannot

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27 be determined for periods of commitment to the custody of the Department of Juvenile Justice.

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
