2	AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE
3	(Proposed by the House Committee on Education
4	on)
5	(Patron Prior to SubstituteDelegate Rasoul)
6	A BILL to amend and reenact § 22.1-298.1, as it shall become effective, of the Code of Virginia and to
7	repeal § 22.1-299.5 of the Code of Virginia, relating to teachers; certain licenses and certificates.
8	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
9	1. That § 22.1-298.1, as it shall become effective, of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted
10	as follows:
11	§ 22.1-298.1. (For effective date, see Acts 2022, cc. 549 and 550, cl. 2) Regulations governing
12	licensure.
13	A. As used in this section:
14	"Alternate route to licensure" means a nontraditional route to teacher licensure available to
15	individuals who meet the criteria specified in the guidelines developed pursuant to subsection N_{O} or
16	regulations issued by the Board-of Education.
17	"Concurrent enrollment" means the enrollment of a qualified student in a postsecondary course
18	that is taught by approved high school faculty, adjunct college faculty, or college faculty at a high school
19	or institution of higher education accredited by an agency recognized by the U.S. Secretary of Education
20	or through an online program recognized by a state education agency. "Concurrent enrollment" includes
21	associate degree transfer programs, career and technical education programs as defined in § 22.1-207.01,
22	and noncredit industry-recognized credentials including those offered through the Virginia Community
23	College System workforce programs that are funded through the New Economy Workforce Credentials
24	Grant Program.
25	"Core subject or course" means an English language arts, mathematics, science, or history and
26	social science course offered by a school, school division, or institution of higher education.

27	"Dual enrollment" means the enrollment of a qualified high school student in a postsecondary
28	course that is creditable toward high school completion and a career certificate or an associate or
29	baccalaureate degree at a public institution of higher education. "Dual enrollment" does not include the
30	enrollment of a qualified high school student in a postsecondary course that is not creditable toward high
31	school completion.
32	"Industry certification credential" means an active career and technical education credential that is
33	earned by successfully completing a Board of Education approved Board-approved industry certification
34	examination, being issued a professional license in the Commonwealth, or successfully completing an
35	occupational competency examination.
36	"Licensure by reciprocity" means a process used to issue the issuance of a license as a teacher in
37	the Commonwealth to an individual coming into the Commonwealth from another state when that
38	individual meets certain conditions specified in the Board of Education's Board's regulations.
39	"Non-core subject or course" means any subject or course offered by a school, school division, or
40	institution of higher education that does not fit the criteria of a core subject or course.
41	"Professional teacher's assessment" means those tests mandated for licensure as prescribed by the
42	Board-of Education.
43	"Provisional license" means a nonrenewable license issued by the Board-of-Education for a
44	specified period of time, not to exceed three years, or by a division superintendent for a period of one year
45	as permitted pursuant to subdivision D 5 to an individual who may be employed by a school division in
46	the Commonwealth and who generally meets the requirements specified in the-Board of Education's
47	Board's regulations for licensure, but who may need to take additional coursework, pass additional
48	assessments, or meet alternative evaluation standards to be fully licensed with a renewable license.
49	"Renewable license" means a license issued by the Board-of Education for 10 years to an individual
50	who meets the requirements specified in the Board of Education's Board's regulations.
51	"Subject matter expert teaching certificate" means a teaching certificate issued in accordance with
52	the provisions of subsection P, the purpose of which is to provide high-quality teaching candidates who
53	have relevant work experience or expertise in a content or subject matter, in addition to substantial

- 54 <u>experience in K-12 instruction, pedagogy, assessment design, classroom management, and working with</u>
 55 diverse learners, an accelerated path toward a renewable license.
- 56 <u>"Universal licensure by reciprocity" means the issuance of a license as a teacher in the</u>
 57 Commonwealth to any individual who meets the requirements set forth in 8VAC20-23-100.

58 B. The Board-of Education shall prescribe, by regulation, the requirements for the licensure of 59 teachers and other school personnel required to hold a license. Such regulations shall include procedures 60 for (i) the denial, suspension, cancellation, revocation, and reinstatement of licensure; (ii) written 61 reprimand of license holders on grounds established by the Board, in accordance with law, notice of which 62 shall be made by the Superintendent-of Public Instruction to division superintendents or their designated 63 representatives; and (iii) the immediate and thorough investigation by the division superintendent or his 64 designee of any complaint alleging that a license holder has engaged in conduct that may form the basis 65 for the revocation of his license. At a minimum, such procedures for investigations contained in such 66 regulations shall require (a) the division superintendent to petition for the revocation of the license upon 67 completing such investigation and finding that there is reasonable cause to believe that the license holder **68** has engaged in conduct that forms the basis for revocation of a license; (b) the school board to proceed to 69 a hearing on such petition for revocation within 90 days of the mailing of a copy of the petition to the 70 license holder, unless the license holder requests the cancellation of his license in accordance with Board 71 regulations; and (c) the school board to provide a copy of the investigative file and such petition for 72 revocation to the Superintendent-of Public Instruction at the time that the hearing is scheduled. The Board 73 of Education shall revoke the license of any person for whom it has received a notice of dismissal or 74 resignation pursuant to subsection F of § 22.1-313 and, in the case of a person who is the subject of a 75 founded complaint of child abuse or neglect, after all rights to any administrative appeal provided by § 76 63.2-1526 have been exhausted. In the case of a teacher who is the subject of a founded complaint of child 77 abuse or neglect and whose license has been revoked pursuant to this subsection, in the event that a court 78 reverses such finding of abuse or neglect and the individual submits to the Department an application for 79 the reinstatement of his license as a teacher, the Board shall consider and act upon such application no 80 later than 90 days after the date of submission. Regardless of the authority of any other agency of the

81 Commonwealth to approve educational programs, only the Board-of Education shall have the authority to
82 license teachers to be regularly employed by school boards, including those teachers employed to provide
83 nursing education.

84 The Board-of Education shall prescribe by regulation the licensure requirements for teachers who
85 teach only online courses, as defined in § 22.1-212.23. Such license shall be valid only for teaching online
86 courses. Teachers who hold a 10-year renewable license issued by the Board-of Education may teach
87 online courses for which they are properly endorsed.

88 C. The Board of Education's Board's regulations shall include requirements that a person seeking
89 initial licensure:

90 1. Demonstrate proficiency in the relevant content area, communication, literacy, and other core 91 skills for educators by achieving a qualifying score on professional assessments or meeting alternative 92 evaluation standards as prescribed by the Board. The literacy assessment for any individual seeking initial 93 licensure with an endorsement in early/primary education preschool through grade three, elementary 94 education preschool through grade six, special education general curriculum kindergarten through grade 95 12, special education deaf and hard of hearing preschool through grade 12, or special education 96 blindness/visual impairments preschool through grade 12 or as a reading specialist shall include a rigorous 97 test of science-based reading research and evidence-based literacy instruction;

98 2. Complete study in attention deficit disorder;

99 3. Complete study in gifted education, including the use of multiple criteria to identify gifted100 students; and

4. Complete study in methods of improving communication between schools and families andways of increasing family involvement in student learning at home and at school.

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D. In addition, such regulations shall include requirements that:

104 1. Every person seeking initial licensure and persons seeking licensure renewal as teachers who
 105 have not completed such study shall complete study in child abuse recognition and intervention in
 106 accordance with curriculum guidelines developed by the Board-of Education in consultation with the
 107 Department of Social Services that are relevant to the specific teacher licensure routes;

2. Every person seeking renewal of a license shall complete all renewal requirements, including
professional development in a manner prescribed by the Board, except that no person seeking renewal of
a license shall be required to satisfy any such requirement by completing coursework and earning credit
at an institution of higher education;

112 3. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license shall provide evidence of 113 completion of certification or training in emergency first aid, cardiopulmonary resuscitation, and the use 114 of automated external defibrillators. The certification or training program shall (i) be based on the current 115 national evidence-based emergency cardiovascular care guidelines for cardiopulmonary resuscitation and 116 the use of an automated external defibrillator, such as a program developed by the American Heart 117 Association or the American Red Cross, and (ii) include hands-on practice of the skills necessary to 118 perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation. The Board shall provide a waiver for this requirement for any 119 person with a disability whose disability prohibits such person from completing the certification or 120 training;

4. Every person seeking licensure with an endorsement as a teacher of the blind and visuallyimpaired shall demonstrate proficiency in reading and writing Braille;

5. Every teacher seeking an initial license in the Commonwealth with an endorsement in the area of career and technical education shall have an industry certification credential in the area in which the teacher seeks endorsement. If a teacher seeking an initial license in the Commonwealth has not attained an industry certification credential in the area in which the teacher seeks endorsement, the Board division superintendent may, upon request of the employing school division or educational agency, issue the teacher a one-year, nonrenewable provisional license to allow time for the teacher to attain upon receipt of a written statement from the teacher that he will seek to attain such credential within one year;

6. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license shall complete awareness training,
provided by the Department, on the indicators of dyslexia, as that term is defined by the Board pursuant
to regulations, and the evidence-based interventions and accommodations for dyslexia;

133 7. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license with an endorsement as a school
134 counselor shall complete training in the recognition of mental health disorder and behavioral distress,
135 including depression, trauma, violence, youth suicide, and substance abuse;

8. Every person seeking initial licensure as a teacher who has not received the instruction described
in subsection D of § 23.1-902 shall receive instruction or training on positive behavior interventions and
supports; crisis prevention and de-escalation; the use of physical restraint and seclusion, consistent with
regulations of the Board-of Education; and appropriate alternative methods to reduce and prevent the need
for the use of physical restraint and seclusion;

141 9. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license shall complete instruction or142 training in cultural competency;

143 10. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license with an endorsement in history144 and social sciences shall complete instruction in African American history, as prescribed by the Board;

145 11. Every person seeking renewal of a license as a teacher shall complete training in the instruction 146 of students with disabilities that includes (i) differentiating instruction for students depending on their 147 needs; (ii) understanding the role of general education teachers on the individualized education program 148 team; (iii) implementing effective models of collaborative instruction, including co-teaching; and (iv) 149 understanding the goals and benefits of inclusive education for all students; and

150 12. Every person seeking initial licensure with an endorsement in early/primary education 151 preschool through grade three, elementary education preschool through grade six, special education 152 general curriculum kindergarten through grade 12, special education deaf and hard of hearing preschool 153 through grade 12, or special education blindness/visual impairments preschool through grade 12 or as a 154 reading specialist shall complete study in science-based reading research and evidence-based literacy 155 instruction.

E. No teacher who seeks a provisional license shall be required to meet any requirement set forth
in subdivision D 1, 3, 6, or 8 as a condition of such licensure, but each such teacher shall complete each
such requirement during the first year of provisional licensure.

159 F. The Board shall issue a license to an individual seeking initial licensure who has not completed 160 professional assessments as prescribed by the Board, if such individual (i) holds a provisional license that 161 will expire within three months or, at the discretion of the school board and division superintendent, within 162 six months if the individual has received a satisfactory mid-year performance review in the current school 163 year; (ii) is employed by a school board; (iii) is recommended for licensure by the division superintendent; 164 (iv) has attempted, unsuccessfully, to obtain a qualifying score on the professional assessments as 165 prescribed by the Board; (v) has received an evaluation rating of proficient or above on the performance 166 standards for each year of the provisional license, and such evaluation was conducted in a manner 167 consistent with the Guidelines for Uniform Performance Standards and Evaluation Criteria for Teachers, 168 Principals, and Superintendents; and (vi) meets all other requirements for initial licensure.

169 G. Each local school board or division superintendent may waive for any individual whom it seeks
170 to employ as a career and technical education teacher and who is also seeking initial licensure or renewal
171 of a license with an endorsement in the area of career and technical education any applicable requirement
172 set forth in subsection C or subdivision D 2, 4, or 6.

H. The Board's regulations shall require that initial licensure for principals and assistant principalsbe contingent upon passage of an assessment as prescribed by the Board.

I. The Board shall establish criteria in its regulations to effectuate the substitution of experiential
learning for coursework for those persons seeking initial licensure through an alternate route as defined in
Board regulations. Such alternate routes shall include eligibility for any individual to receive,
notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, a renewable one-year license to teach in public high
schools in the Commonwealth if he has:

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1. Received a graduate degree from a regionally accredited institution of higher education;

181 2. Completed at least 30 credit hours of teaching experience as an instructor at a regionally182 accredited institution of higher education;

183 3. Received qualifying scores on the professional teacher's assessments prescribed by the Board,
184 including the communication and literacy assessment and the content-area assessment for the endorsement
185 sought. The literacy assessment for any individual seeking initial licensure through an alternate route with

an endorsement in early/primary education preschool through grade three, elementary education preschool
through grade six, special education general curriculum kindergarten through grade 12, special education
deaf and hard of hearing preschool through grade 12, or special education blindness/visual impairments
preschool through grade 12 or as a reading specialist shall include a rigorous test of science-based reading
research and evidence-based literacy instruction; and



4. Met the requirements set forth in subdivisions D 1 and 3.

192 J. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the Board (i) may provide for the issuance 193 of a provisional license, valid for a period not to exceed three years, pursuant to subdivision D 5 or to any 194 person who does not meet the requirements of this section or any other requirement for licensure imposed 195 by law; (ii) shall provide for the issuance of a provisional license, valid for a period not to exceed three 196 years, to any former member of the Armed Forces of the United States or the Virginia National Guard 197 who has received an honorable discharge and has the appropriate level of experience or training but does 198 not meet the requirements for a renewable license; and (iii) may provide for the issuance of a provisional 199 license, valid for a period not to exceed three years, to any individual who has held within the last five 200 years a valid and officially issued and recognized license or certification to teach issued by an entity 201 outside of the United States but does not meet the requirements for a renewable license if the individual's 202 license or certification to teach has been evaluated and verified by an entity approved by the Department.

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K. The Board's licensure regulations shall also provide for licensure by reciprocity:

1. With comparable endorsement areas for those individuals holding a valid out-of-state teaching
 license and national certification from the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards or a
 nationally recognized certification program approved by the Board-of Education. The application for such
 individuals shall require evidence of such valid licensure and national certification and shall not require
 official student transcripts; and

209 2. For any spouse of an active duty or reserve member of the Armed Forces of the United States
210 or a member of the Virginia National Guard who has obtained a valid out-of-state license, with full
211 credentials and without deficiencies, that is in force at the time the application for a Virginia license is
212 received by the Department. Each such individual shall establish a file in the Department by submitting a

213 complete application packet, which shall include official student transcripts and an official copy of the 214 military permanent assignment orders of the individual's spouse. No service requirements or licensing 215 assessments shall be required for any such individual. The Department shall determine and communicate 216 such individual's eligibility for licensure by reciprocity within 15 business days of receipt of the complete 217 application packet; and.

218 3. For L. The Board's licensure regulations shall also provide for universal licensure by reciprocity 219 for individuals who have obtained a valid out-of-state license, with full credentials and without 220 deficiencies, that is in force at the time the application for a Virginia license is received by the Department-221 Each such individual shall establish a file in the Department by submitting a complete application packet, 222 which shall include official student transcripts and who meet all criteria set forth in 8VAC20-23-100. No 223 service requirements or licensing assessments shall be required for any-such individual who applies for 224 universal licensure by reciprocity and meets all criteria set forth in 8VAC20-23-100. Any individual who 225 applies for universal licensure by reciprocity shall provide a copy of the individual's valid out-of-state 226 teaching license with full credentials and without deficiencies that is in force at the time of application. 227 Any such individual shall be subject to a background clearance check, the provisions of §§ 22.1-296.2 and 228 22.1-296.4, and have no pending disciplinary actions or investigations. The Department shall prioritize 229 applications for other types of licensure before universal licensure by reciprocity.

230 L. M. The Board shall include in its regulations an alternate route to licensure for elementary 231 education preschool through grade six and an alternate route to licensure for special education general 232 curriculum kindergarten through grade 12. Each such alternate route to licensure shall require individuals 233 to (i) meet the qualifying scores on the content area assessment prescribed by the Board for the 234 endorsements sought and (ii) complete an alternative certification program that provides training in the 235 pedagogy and methodology of the respective content or special education areas prescribed by the Board. 236 The curriculum of any such alternative certification program shall be approved by the Board. Nothing in 237 this subsection shall preclude the Board from establishing other alternate routes to licensure.

238 M. N. The Board, in its regulations providing for licensure by reciprocity established pursuant to
 239 subsection subsections K and L, shall (i) permit applicants to submit third-party employment verification

forms and (ii) grant special consideration to individuals who have successfully completed a programoffered by a provider that is accredited by the Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation.

242 N.-O. The Board shall develop guidelines that establish a process to permit a school board or any 243 organization sponsored by a school board to petition the Board for approval of an alternate route to 244 licensure that may be used to meet the requirements for a provisional or renewable license or any 245 endorsement. Any such alternate route may include alternatives to the regulatory requirements for teacher 246 preparation, including alternative professional assessments and coursework. The petitioner may proffer or 247 the Board may impose conditions in conjunction with the approval of such petition.

P. The Board may issue a subject matter expert teaching certificate, valid for a period not to exceed
 three years, to any individual who has expertise in a content or subject matter area in order for such
 individual to provide instruction or coursework in such content or subject matter area in grades six through
 12 at any public school in the Commonwealth or at an institution of higher education in the
 Commonwealth, including dual enrollment or concurrent enrollment courses.

253 For a teaching candidate applying for a subject matter expert teaching certificate for a core subject 254 or course, expertise in a content or subject matter area shall be demonstrated through (i) passage of the 255 Praxis subject test for the content or subject matter area to be taught; (ii) possession of a baccalaureate 256 degree, a master's degree, or a doctoral degree from a regionally or nationally accredited public or private 257 institution of higher education in the content or subject matter area to be taught; (iii) submission of written 258 proof of full-time employment at a regionally or nationally accredited public or private institution of 259 higher education during which the individual successfully taught courses relevant to the content or subject 260 matter area for at least five years; and (iv) submission of written proof of the completion of coursework

as set forth in subdivisions 1, 2, 3, 5, and 6 of 8VAC20-23-190 or substantially similar coursework.

For a teaching candidate applying for a subject matter expert teaching certificate for a non-core
 subject or course, expertise in a content or subject matter area may be demonstrated through (i) passage
 of a content or subject matter area test; (ii) possession of a baccalaureate degree, a master's degree, or a
 doctoral degree from a regionally or nationally accredited public or private institution of higher education
 in the relevant content or subject matter area; (iii) either submission of written proof of full-time

employment at a regionally or nationally accredited public or private institution of higher education during
which the individual successfully taught courses relevant to the content or subject matter area for at least
five years or submission of written proof of employment or valid, relevant licensure during which the
individual gained at least five years of full-time professional work experience in the specific content or
subject area to be taught; and (iv) submission of written proof of the completion of coursework as set forth
in subdivisions 1, 2, 3, 5, and 6 of 8VAC20-23-190 or substantially similar coursework.

273 Q. No individual who seeks a subject matter expert teaching certificate pursuant to subsection P 274 shall be required, as a condition of the issuance of such certificate, to demonstrate professional knowledge 275 proficiency except as otherwise required in subsection P. School divisions and institutions of higher 276 education may hire subject matter expert teachers on a full-time or part-time basis. Any such individual 277 shall be subject to a background clearance check, the provisions of §§ 22.1-296.2 and 22.1-296.4, and 278 have no pending disciplinary actions or investigations. The employing school board or institution of higher 279 education shall assign a mentor to supervise any individual issued a three-year subject matter expert 280 teaching certificate during his first two years of teaching and shall pay such mentor a stipend in an amount 281 equal to two percent of his annual salary as compensation for such additional professional responsibility. 282 Such mentor shall be an individual employed by a local school board in a Standards of Quality-funded 283 position and such stipend shall be subject to a state match through the Standards of Quality.

284 <u>R. Subject matter expert teaching certificates are nonrenewable and shall neither be construed as</u>
 285 nor contribute toward provisional licensure. Upon the expiration of a subject matter expert teaching
 286 certificate, any individual employed under a subject matter expert teaching certificate shall be required to
 287 obtain a provisional license or renewable license as a condition of continued employment as a teacher.

288 <u>S. Each school board shall evaluate subject matter expert teachers in the school division consistent</u>
 289 with the performance objectives set forth in the Guidelines for Uniform Performance Standards and
 290 Evaluation Criteria for Teachers, Administrators, and Superintendents as required by § 22.1-253.13:5.

291 <u>T. Each school division shall annually report to the Department the number of subject matter expert</u>
 292 <u>teaching certificates issued for part-time teaching positions and full-time teaching positions pursuant to</u>
 293 this section, delineated by subject area, course, and grade level. The Department shall annually track and

294 report on its website the number of subject matter expert teaching certificates issued by school divisions,

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- 295 <u>delineated by school division, school, subject area, course, and grade level.</u>
- 296 2. That § 22.1-299.5 of the Code of Virginia is repealed.
