| | Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: |
| 10 | 1. That § 22.1-207 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted and that the Code of Virginia |
| 11 | is amended by adding a section number 22.1-207.1:2 as follows: |
| 12 | § 22.1-207. Physical and health education. |
| 13 | Physical and health education shall be emphasized throughout the public school curriculum by |
| 14 | lessons, drills, and physical exercises, and all pupils in the public elementary, middle, and high schools |
| 15 | shall receive as part of the educational program such health instruction and physical training as shall be |
| 16 | prescribed by the Board-of Education and approved by the State Board of Health. Such health instruction |
| 17 | shall incorporate standards that recognize the multiple dimensions of health by including mental health |
| 18 | and the relationship of physical and mental health so as to enhance student understanding, attitudes, and |
| 19 | behavior that promote health, well-being, and human dignity. Such health instruction may include an age- |
| 20 | appropriate program of instruction on the safe use of and risks of abuse of prescription drugs that is |
| 21 | consistent with curriculum guidelines developed by the Board and approved by the State Board of Health. |
| 22 | Any such health instruction offered to students in grades four through eight shall incorporate a program |
| 23 | of instruction on menstrual education pursuant to the provisions of § 22.1-207.1:2. |

A. The Board shall develop Standards of Learning objectives and accompanying curriculum
guidelines for instruction on menstrual education to be provided as a part of any health education program

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| 27 | offered to students at grade levels four through eight, pursuant to § 22.1-207. Such Standards of Learning |
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| 28 | objectives and accompanying curriculum guidelines shall include, at such grade levels as the Board deems |
| 29 | appropriate, instruction on: |
| 30 | 1. The biological processes and functions of the menstrual cycle, including the menstrual cycle at |
| 31 | different stages of human development, from puberty to menopause; |
| 32 | 2. Information on symptoms and side effects of the menstrual cycle, including premenstrual |
| 33 | syndrome, menstrual cramps and safe pain management, menstrual cycle management, menstrual |
| 34 | disorders, and menstrual irregularities; |
| 35 | 3. Societal and cultural attitudes toward the menstrual cycle, including awareness of the impacts |
| 36 | of stigmas surrounding the menstrual cycle on health and the behavior of individuals and the importance |
| 37 | of destigmatizing the menstrual cycle; and |
| 38 | 4. Other topics relating to the menstrual cycle. |
| 39 | B. Each school board shall, in accordance with the provisions of subsection A, provide as a part |
| 40 | of any health education program offered at grade levels four through eight instruction on menstrual |
| 41 | education, consistent with the Standards of Learning objectives and accompanying curriculum guidelines |
| 42 | developed by the Board pursuant to subsection A. Each school board shall provide such instruction on |
| 43 | menstrual education to each student at each grade level, four through eight, regardless of gender, provided |
| 44 | that the parent of each such student shall have the right to excuse his child from participation in such |
| 45 | instruction. Each school board shall adopt policies and procedures providing for the timely notification of |
| 46 | each parent of any student in grade levels four through eight of such parent's right to excuse his child from |
| 47 | participation in such instruction on menstrual education and the process by which such parent may |
| 48 | exercise such right. |
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
